Worship for February 7

Welcome

Good morning and welcome to worship with McClure United Church this morning. It is such a comfort and fills me with so much gratitude knowing that folks from this community as well as anyone else who may have stumbled upon this service are joining us to celebrate God's presence in our lives. And we really need to take any opportunity we can to celebrate God's love... a love that is alive and moving within us and all around us. And that's what we will be focusing on today – all the ways that God continues to be known – a reminder that even a nasty pandemic can't keep God away.

And as we celebrate this truth, we also celebrate and give thanks that we are privileged to be gathering on land that has been loved and tended, for many generations, by the first peoples' of this land – we acknowledge that here in Saskatoon we are on Treaty 6 territory - homeland of the Metis people and we pay our respect to the ancestors and keepers of the land.

We also celebrate that this congregation publicly declares our intention live out our commitment as an Affirming Ministry to welcome all of God's people into our love – people of all age, class, ability, race, gender, gender identity and sexual orientation and welcomed and celebrated in this space.

First... and most important.... today at 11am is our Congregational Meeting to talk our 2021 budget. Information on how to connect to this Zoom gathering is on our website. Our new weekly Bible study has begun. We are gathering each Wednesday at 1pm for about an hour. This study is lectionary based and so folks are welcome to

join when they are able – there is no commitment to come each week – although you are certainly welcome to do so

Also happening now is a fantastic project of our Outreach Committee called "Plant a Heart for Refugees". For every \$20 donation received during the month of February, a heart will be planted in the snowbacks in front of the church. Cash, cheque or e-transfer are accepted. Please be sure to designate your donation to McClure United Church – Refugees".

We are also now preparing for Lent – and I have two announcements I'd like to share related to that. First, we will be offering a live Zoom Ash Wednesday service for this interested in joining. That service will be on Wednesday, February 17th at 7pm. All you need to participate is the Zoom link, a small bowl of water, and a candle if you have one. And the next evening at 7pm we will begin our Lenten Book Study series. We will be using the United Church's Lenten book "Faith on the Move" for the study. The books have arrived. If you did not order a book, I see they now have an e-copy available at UCRD for \$7.95. I will put the link for that on the Facebook page.

I bless GOD every chance I get; my lungs expand with praise.
I live and breathe GOD; if things aren't going well, hear this and be happy:
Join me in spreading the news; together let's get the word out.
GOD met me more than halfway and freed me from my anxious fears.

Look at God; give your warmest smile. Never hide your feelings from God. When I was desperate, I called out, and GOD got me out of a tight spot. GOD's angel sets up a circle of protection around us while we pray. Open your mouth and taste, open your eyes and see— how good GOD is. Blessed are you who run to God. Worship GOD if you want the best; worship opens doors to all God's goodness. Young lions on the prowl get hungry, but God-seekers are full of God. Come, children, listen closely; I'll give you a lesson in GOD worship. Who out there has a lust for life? Can't wait each day to come upon beauty? Reflection

The Psalm Dawn read for us is one of joy and gratitude for God's loving presence. Certainly something to be joyful about. I, for one, can't imagine what my life would be like without God's love – a love that I experience in the deepest way through connection with others.

And its true that I... along with many of you, I'm sure... am longing for the day when I can hug and shake hands and smile with my mouth at people I at the grocery store. And it would certainly be easy for me to get fully caught up in that longing... but in the same way that the writer of the Psalm finds it in himself to praise God right there in the midst of desperation... of heartbreak... of moaning and groaning... of sin... it is essential that I, that we, find it in ourselves to praise God in the midst of whatever struggle we may be going through at the moment. Church is not what it was a year ago... But we have not stopped being the church – in fact there are many ways in which we are more active, reaching more people, and being more creative about how we share God's love – of how we live our lives as disciples.
