Luke 12.1-8

Meanwhile, when the crowd gathered by the thousands, so that they trampled on one another, he began to speak first to his disciples, "Beware of the yeast of the Pharisees, that is, their hypocrisy. ²Nothing is covered up that will not be uncovered, and nothing secret that will not become known. ³Therefore whatever you have said in the dark will be heard in the light, and what you have whispered behind closed doors will be proclaimed from the housetops. ⁴"I tell you, my friends, do not fear those who kill the body, and after that can do nothing more. ⁵But I will warn you whom to fear: fear him who, after he has killed, has authority to cast into hell. Sermon: Rev. Debra Berg

Prayer: May the words of my mouth and the meditations of our hearts be acceptable to you O God, our strength and our redeemer. Amen.

"Are not five sparrows sold for two pennies? Yet not one of them is forgotten in God's sight. ⁷But even the hairs of your head are all counted. Do not be afraid; you are of more value than many sparrows.

Do not be afraid – Jesus says to his disciples. Last week they were in a boat and were watching Jesus walk on water. Jesus walking right into the storm and they were afraid. And he said to them "Do not be afraid". This week the disciples are being bullied by the religious leaders and it is getting ugly and Jesus is telling them once again. "Do not be afraid".

"Do no be afraid" is one of the most common themes found I the Bible. I find it rather challenging. Because, I don't know about you – but I have been outside – and there is lots of things to be afraid of out there.

COVID brought a whole level of fear into our lives. We became afraid of our own family and our neighbors. We wore masks and washed our hands until they were raw - in fear that we might catch or pass on a truly deadly virus. There is lots be afraid of. It is why we stand behind barriers at the zoo. //// We watch the news each evening so we can plan to stay as far away as possible from the latest natural disaster or human created disaster. We stay away from the doctor's office because we're afraid to hear what the doctor might say. Some of us hide from new relationships

because we were afraid of being hurt again and some of us lie - we lie to ourselves and others to hide that which we are truly afraid - that we are inadequate - a fraud - a failure - not smart enough - not good enough.

Quite frankly friends there is plenty to be afraid of - what's on your list?

There is plenty to be afraid of and quite frankly sometimes our fears keep us and those we love safe. So, what does "do not be afraid" really mean?

Maybe we are being asked to add- being unafraid – to our check list of what we think we need to do to be a good Christian. You know the list, we create in our minds, so we will be better.

I will:

Love my neighbour, love my enemy, share my stuff, stop cursing at people who cut me off in traffic, recycle and to really prove I got this Christian thing in the bag – I will not be afraid. //

I don't think this is what God is asking of us. I don't think living without fear is a character trait that we should be trying to aspire to. I think fear is something else in God's realm.

I think fear is a thief. Fear steals away love, joy and justice. Fear steals away the things God hopes for us. I think "do not be afraid" is a warning.

I think this is what Jesus is trying to get at, in our gospel reading today. Jesus is talking to the disciples, giving them some words of encouragement, he speaks to them about the ones who would speak against his way, about those who would try and take away the good news of love and joy and justice. Jesus tells his disciples to not be afraid of them. I think Jesus is telling them not to let fear of the other, steal away what they know to be true.

In past year we have watched a new movement grow, the black lives matters movement. We have watched as people of colour have not let fear steal away their rights, their dignity and their truth.

We have heard indigenous people in the midst of grief not let fear steal away their rights, their dignity and their truth.

We have heard members of the LGBTQ+ community not let fear steal away their rights, their dignity and their truth.

We have heard those for whom Mental Health is a challenge not let fear steal away their rights, their dignity and their truth.

I think Jesus is telling all of us to not let fear of the other, steal away what we know to be true. Jesus asks us all to, not be afraid of those who would try and take away the good news of love and joy and justice.

Rosa Louise McCauley Parks was an African-American activist in the civil rights movement best known for her pivotal role in the Montgomery bus boycott. The United States Congress has honored her as "the first lady of civil rights" and "the mother of the freedom movement". 11 On December 1, 1955, in Montgomery, Alabama, Parks rejected bus driver James F. Blake's order to vacate a row of four seats in the "colored" section in favor of a white passenger, once the "white" section was filled. Parks was not the first person to resist bus segregation, but the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) believed that she was the best candidate for seeing through a court challenge after her arrest for civil disobedience in violating Alabama segregation laws, and she helped inspire the black community to boycott the Montgomery buses for over a year. The case became bogged down in the state courts, but the federal Montgomery bus lawsuit resulted in a decision that bus segregation is unconstitutional.

Elijah Harper was thrust into the history books for his actions during the federal government's attempt in 1990 to enact the Meech Lake Accord, crafted to secure Quebec's signature on the Constitution. In order for the Accord to be ratified, it required province-by-province agreement. Manitoba MLAs were asked to waive a two-day waiting period in order to speed up approval of the resolution. MLA Harper, frustrated by the fact that Aboriginal issues were not included in the Accord discussions, refused to allow rules to be waived. The iconic image of Elijah Harper, eagle feather in hand, steadfastly and quietly repeating "No" until the deadline for signing had passed, lives on.

The list of those who have stood in the face of difficult consequences, who have stood in fear, but who have stood regardless for what they believe to be true and right is long.

"Do not be afraid" Jesus says. Do not to let fear of the other, steal away what you know to be true. Jesus asks us all, to not be afraid of those who would try and take away the good news of love and joy and justice.
